News •••• Cat & Dog Improvements -

CAT - This year we did some lifestyle improvements for the cats at the shelter. A community room was added, allowing some of the long-term kitties to have a





larger space to roam, with wall boxes, kitty condos and a Kuranda tower. We also added a 'catio' off our back porch, that allows our kitties to have 'outdoor time'. The catio features a screened in area with toys and outdoor furniture, as well as much needed fresh air. Birdfeeders will be installed in the spring so the kitties can bird watch.

DOG - Through the Kendal C and Anna Ham Charitable Foundation we were able to improve our outside dog runs with new fencing and concrete. We took down 3 of our existing yards and were able to make 3 new ones with new chain link, concrete steps down to the yards and a concrete pad in the front of the yards to prevent dogs from wearing down the dirt



and digging out. We also were able to put in new chain link and expand our two, smaller socializing yards. The Kendal C and Anna Ham Charitable Foundation has been very generous, allowing us to revamp the inside dog kennels with glass block walls and epoxy floors, as well as numerous other projects over the years. We are truly grateful to this foundation for their continued support and generosity.
